

Thirubuvanam Kampaheswarar temple

Where Shiva quelled quaking heart

Nestled in the serene town of Thirubuvanam near Kumbakonam, the Kampaheswarar Temple - also known as Sarabeswarar Temple - is a resplendent monument to the spiritual and architectural grandeur of the Chola dynasty. Here, Lord Shiva is venerated as Kampaheswarar, the one who dispelled the trembling (Sanskrit: Kampa) of a tormented king. The temple is not just a sacred sanctuary but also a site of historical significance, mythological wonder, and divine architecture.

It is among the revered Vaippu Sthalams, sanctified in the hymns of Tamil Saivite saint Appar (Thirunavukkarasar), bearing testimony to its ancient spiritual legacy.

Inscriptions on the southern wall of the sanctum reveal that this majestic temple was constructed under the reign of Chola emperor Kulothunga Chola III, around 1176 CE. Built as a memorial to his victorious northern military campaign, the temple stands as one of the final flourishes of the great Chola architectural legacy.

Four significant inscriptions in Grantha script attributed to Kulothunga Chola offer glimpses into temple endowments and construction. One inscription (No. 190 of 1907) directly references



the king's temple-building efforts. Another inscription references Arya Sri-Somanatha, suggesting a possible connection or spiritual inspiration. Interestingly, inscriptions also mention local contracts and village watchmen (urkaval), pointing to an organized administrative system tied to temple upkeep.

In addition, two Tamil inscriptions from the rule of Jatavarman Tribhuvanachakravartin Parakrama Pandya (registered in 1911) detail civic and temple

responsibilities of nearby villages like Tribhuvanavirapuram and Kulamangalanadu. This blend of royal patronage and community participation underlines the temple's importance not just as a spiritual center, but as a socio-political hub.

Kampaheswarar Temple follows the canonical Dravidian style but with a remarkable twist: its vimana (sanctum tower) rises dramatically taller than the gopuram (gateway tower) - an architectural rarity in Tamil Nadu temples, where usually the gopuram dominates.

This soaring vimana draws stylistic parallels to the Chola trinity of sacred architecture: the Brihadeeswarar Temple in Thanjavur, Airavatesvara Temple at Darasuram, and the Gangaikonda Cholapuram temple. All share this uncommon feature of vimana supremacy, symbolizing the upward ascent of divine energy and inner enlightenment.

Inside, the temple is adorned with finely carved pillars, stone inscriptions, and symbolic reliefs, preserving the artistic brilliance of the late Chola period.

Two captivating legends surround Kampaheswarar, both highlighting Shiva's role as the compassionate protector:

One tells of a remorseful king plagued by a Brahmarakshasa (a fearsome spirit of a wronged Brahmin). Haunted and trembling, the king sought refuge in Lord Shiva, who appeared and dispelled his fears - hence the name Kampaheswarar, the one who removes trembling.

Another tale is deeply theological: after Lord Vishnu manifested as Narasimha to destroy the demon Hiranyakashipu, his wrath was so intense that it threatened universal harmony. To pacify Narasimha, Shiva assumed the formidable form of Sarabeswarar-a composite being with features of a man, lion, and bird. This rare aspect of Shiva is enshrined in a separate sanctum within the temple, making it one of the few in India to house a dedicated Sarabeswarar shrine.

The temple's main sanctum houses Lord Shiva as Kampaheswarar, and his consort Kampaheswari (a fierce form of Durga). The shrine of Sarabeswarar-depicted with a lion's face, eagle wings, and human body-is particularly significant for those seeking protection from intense spiritual and psychological disturbances.

Additional shrines honor Lord Ganesha and Lord Murugan, creating a holistic space for devotees of different divine manifestations.

Daily pujas (rituals) are performed with devotion by trained priests, beginning with early morning abhishekams (ritual baths) and extending into serene evening deeparadhanais (lamp offerings).

The temple follows traditional Shaiva Agamic rituals, invoking blessings for both physical and spiritual well-being.

The spiritual energy of the temple comes alive during its vibrant festivals:

- Maha Shivaratri:** An all-night celebration of Shiva's cosmic dance and divine marriage.
- Aadi Pooram** (July–August): Dedicated to Goddess Kamakshi (Durga), this festival attracts women devotees in large numbers for special prayers.
- Navaratri:** Nine nights of devotion celebrating the divine feminine in her many forms. Each night is marked by music, dance, and deeply symbolic rituals.
- Arudra Darshan** (December–January): Honoring Lord Nataraja, Shiva's form as the Cosmic Dancer.
- Pradosham:** Occurring twice a month, this is a sacred time to cleanse sins and gain spiritual merit.

- Karthikai Deepam** (November–December): The temple glows with thousands of oil lamps, symbolizing the triumph of light over darkness.

Benefits
Devotees often perform specific archanaais (offerings)

seeking relief from illness, mental distress, or legal troubles. Many believe that praying here brings protection from malevolent forces, emotional stability, and success in life's battles.

The temple is open to devotees during the following hours: Morning: 6:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Evening: 4:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Sarah appointed first woman Archbishop of Canterbury

London, Oct 4: Sarah Mullally, whose calling to Christian ministry came after a distinguished career in nursing, will be the new Archbishop of Canterbury, becoming the first woman to hold the role in its 1,400-year history and the spiritual leader of 85 million Anglicans worldwide.

Mullally, 63, was made Bishop of London in 2018 - the Church of England's third most senior bishop after the archbishops of Canterbury and York. Before her ordination, Mullally worked as a nurse at hospitals in London, going on to serve as

"As I respond to the call of Christ to this new ministry, I do so in the same spirit of service to God and to others that has motivated me since I first came to faith as a teenager," Mullally said after her appointment was announced on Friday.

"At every stage of that journey, through my nursing career and Christian ministry, I have learned to listen deeply - to people and to God's gentle prompting - to seek to bring people together to find hope and healing." Mullally will preside over



an institution struggling to stay relevant in a more secular nation, attempting to bridge divides between its more conservative and liberal wings, and fighting to reclaim trust after a child abuse cover-up scandal.
