IMPHAL, Sept 10: The authorities in Manipur imposed curfew within the jurisdiction of Imphal East and Imphal West districts with effect from 11 am on Tuesday, and also restricted the movement of persons from their residences in Thoubal district from noon today in view of the prevailing law and order situation arising out of the widespread students' protest.

The district magistrate of Imphal West, additional district magistrate of Imphal East, and district magistrate of Thoubal district issued separate orders in this regard.

"In supersession of all earlier orders issued in this regard, the curfew relaxation period for 10th September, 2024 (Tuesday) is hereby lifted with effect from 11:00 am of today i.e. 10th September, 2024," said the order issued by the district magistrate of Imphal West. Similarly, total curfew was

imposed in Imphal East district with immediate effect and until further orders "due to the developing law and order situation in the district", according to an order issued by the additional district magistrate.

The curfew was imposed a day after the State witnessed a massive protest by students over the State Government's inaction into the ongoing violence.

The students are demanding changes to the State's security arrangement including resignation of the Security Advisor and DGP on moral ground for their failure to control the violence. The other demands include handing over of the Unified Command of Manipur to the Chief Minister and the people's

elected Government and withdrawal of Central paramilitary forces from Manipur as they have been acting as mute spectators.

on Tuesday afternoon, the Raj Bhavan in Imphal said, "Peace and people's cooperation are the only means which bring societal development. Manipur, the 'land of jewels', is not an exception." Stating that this State for a

long time has been an important entity for taking all-round development of India to greater heights, it said that the State for the last few months has been in turmoil, and that some unpleasant incidents gave a severe jolt to the ef-

forts of the Central and State

Governments towards restoring peace and normalcy. Governor Acharya expressed deep concern, and said that violence is not the solution to any problem, and everyone will have to contribute and find ways to overcome this problem.

PTI adds from Imphal: Over 40 students were injured on Tuesday following clashes with security forces when they attempted to march towards the Raj Bhavan in Imphal to press for their demands to remove the DGP and Security Advisor to the State Government, police said.

Thousands of students and women demonstrators tried to march towards the Raj Bhavan on BT Road here, but were stopped by security forces near the Congress Bhavan.

The agitators shouted slogans and pelted security personnel with stones and glass marble balls, forcing the men in uniform to fire tear gas shells to disperse them, a police officer said.

Manipur University students also staged a protest rally and burnt the effigy of Union Home Minister Amit Shah. They later headed for the State Secretariat, but were stopped at Kakwa in Imphal West district.

"More than 40 students were injured in the clashes and have been admitted to hospital," the officer said.

#### Meghalaya Police SI suspended

SHILLONG, Sept 10: Meghalaya Police suspended Sub-Inspector E Marwein on Tuesday after he rejected an FIR at the Laban Police Station here allegedly in an inebriated state. Police initiated an inquiry headed by the sector officer, and following the report, the officer was suspended. The incident happened late at night on September 9 when a woman was allegedly assaulted by a taxi driver. The woman went to the police station to report the case. However, Marwein, allegedly under the influence of alcohol, refused to register the FIR. The incident was recorded by the victim's friends and family who had gone to the police station to lodge the FIR. Meanwhile, police said that the FIR has been registered by the Women Police Station. - Staff Correspondent

## Pharmacy licences cancelled

DIMAPUR, Sept 10: The State Drugs Control Authority (SDCA), under the Nagaland health and family welfare department, has cancelled the licences of five pharmacies and suspended those of four for illegal sale of restricted drugs. The SDCA, in a release on Tuesday, said that the licences of two pharmacies in Dimapur and one each in Akuluto under Zunheboto district, and Niuland and Tsumang B in Wokha have been cancelled. The licence of one pharmacy in Dilong ward under Mokokchung, two licenses in New Jalukie under Peren district and that of a pharmacy in Mhainamtsi, also in Peren, have been suspended. - Correspondent

#### Woman killed in Manipur crossfire

IMPHAL, Sept 10: A 46-year-old woman was killed after getting caught in a clash between two armed groups in Manipur's Kangpokpi district, police said on Tuesday. The incident happened in the remote Thangbuh village on Sunday night. A few houses in the village were torched, forcing the locals to flee to nearby forests. The deceased woman was identified as Nemjakhol Lhungdim. Her body was handed over to her family after a post-mortem examination at the Churachandpur district hospital. Many powerful bombs were discharged during the clash. - PTI

Assuring that every single penny spent from the State exchequer would have to be returned, Sangma said that the money "misused" for such police escort and security cover would have to be refunded by the police officer, who toed the line of "their political bosses". "We will seek accountability," he said.

Sangma said that the present State Government has several advisors to the Chief Minister. "This Government runs on nepotism," he said, even as he avoided answering questions on the appointment of the CM's sister and former MP Agatha Sangma as the chairperson of the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights.

He said that the appointment of Agatha Sangma should not be viewed in isolation, but the larger picture should be highlighted. Political appointees are "showing off" with escorts and police cover and this has become a "nuisance and an eyesore" for the public, he added.

On political appointees during his tenure as the CM. Sangma said that such appointments were given to "sustain the democratic system" in the era of coalition politics. "But not to this extent... Do we know how many CM's advisors are there now? Don't do it to the extent that it becomes a nuisance and an eyesore to the common man," he said.

AGARTALA, Sept 10: Tripura Chief Minister Manik Saha on Tuesday said that the State Government will not tolerate any attack on journalists. Saha said that the culture of attacking journalists developed over the past 35 years of governance and stressed the need for change.

"I have observed how journalists work tirelessly. I have a personal connection with them and believe in action. Journalists are always on the ground, constantly working. We are committed to ensuring their safety and security. However, it's important to acknowledge that in the past, no one took proper action. You must not forget history. Journalists now have easier access to justice. I have directed the immediate arrest of those involved in attacks on journalists. This was part of a culture, and some have developed the habit of attacking journalists. We must take steps to create a peaceful environment," he said.

Four local journalists were beaten up at the heart of Agartala on Sunday night by some goons. Police arrested all the three accused named in the FIR and seized their vehicle on Monday. The Agartala Press Club condemned the incident and demanded exemplary punishment to the culprits.

# USTM joins hands with NGO on stem cell donor campaign

GUWAHATI, Sept 10: To raise awareness about the increasing prevalence of blood cancer and the crucial role of stem cell transplant as a treatment option, nonprofit organisation DKMS BMST Foundation India, which is dedicated to fighting blood cancer, conducted a donor registration drive at the University of Science and Technology Meghalaya (USTM) on Tuesday, stated a press release.

The drive aimed to encourage

young people to come forward and register as potential stem cell donors. A press meet was held on Tuesday by the Bengaluru-based DKMS BMST (Bangalore Medical Services Trust) and USTM to spread awareness regarding stem cell donation to give new life to blood cancer patients. Dr Minerva Mary and Syantan Dutta Gupta of DKMS BMST, USTM vice chancellor Prof GD Sharma, PIMC principal Prof Dr Biraj Kumar

Das, and National Service Scheme Youth Officer Nakul Chandra Deori addressed the meet. Stem cell donor Gautam Kumar from Jharkhand shared his experience throughout the process of donation, and his happiness in being able to give a new life to someone. He said that due to lack of awareness in India, people do not come forward to donate stem cells.

Dr Minerva Mary emphasised the need for more young people to join the donor registry. "Every 5 minutes, someone in India is diagnosed with blood cancer or a blood disorder like Thalassemia or Aplastic Anaemia. Many such patients are children and young people whose only chance of recovery is a stem cell transplant."
